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Study Programme

All students will be enrolled on a study programme and are expected to attend all components of this programme.

Example of study programme

Vocational Study	Health and Social Care related study - This will comprise of coursework, assessments and practical work experience.
English and Maths	GCSE re-sit if students enter the course with D Functional skills if students have below D
Work Experience	Minimum of 30 hours work experience - plus vocational hours as directed by the exam board
Enrichment and Tutorial programme	Study skills and teambuilding activities as per timetable
