



ESSENTIAL READING





A note on educational recovery:

The long shadow of social distancing, mask-wearing and limited interaction continues to impact upon individuals as they progress from School into College. A lack of socialisation has slowed the general development of speech and language. We continue to report some poor behaviour as learners readjust to classrooms, corridors and each other. Over the period between 2020 and 2023 some learners made less progress than usual and a lack of effective mainstream education, particularly early on and in foundation, has rendered the SEND system less effective for learners with additional need.

The entire education sector continues to face challenges- not least issues around attendance and staffing. Over the 'covid-years' (benchmarks were not available) but we held targets broadly stable to acknowledge the challenges while maintaining our ambition to deliver an outstanding education for all.

These targets have been designed to continue to support you to build back; but they also look-forward. It is not easy to anticipate the priorities and challenges of the years ahead. But we know we want to emphasise high quality teaching, learning, assessment and feedback whilst doing all we can to encourage and facilitate reading fluency, speech and communication development, socialisation, physical dexterity; the use of number and digital literacy.

Achieving the targets laid out below will require:

- Maintaining an ambitious curriculum which is challenging and varied, and gives learners the opportunity and aspiration to excel.
- Ensuring that the curriculum is planned effectively to provide support and challenge to ensure that learners' needs are met.
- Knowing your learners well so that you can ensure that their needs are met (including targets set within Education, Health and Care Plans) and that you can challenge them effectively and give them useful feedback.
- Inspiring learners and motivating them (through clear and developmental targets) to take responsibility for their own learning.
- Setting equally ambitious targets for all learners that supports them to make good progress and prepares them well for their future careers.
- Working effectively with our community and local employers to ensure that your curriculum is innovative and continues to meet market needs.
