Welcome to the SGSPlus+ End of Year Report for 2021-22.

The aim of this report is to celebrate some of the success that the SGSPlus+ team have had throughout the academic year 2021-22. ThIS academic year saw students return to face to face education and socialisation for the first time since the Covid-19 pandemic. Consequently, students have missed out on key parts of their education, however, importantly students had missed out on key elements of social development throughout that period. Therefore, the year 2021-22 saw the full integration of the SGSPlus+ programme at the College incorporating Tutorials, Enrichment, Work Placements and Careers resulting in the most successful year of Enrichment to date. Below are some key points that have allowed us to achieve that;

- Introducing the SGSPlus+ Framework: Pivotal to the SGSPlus+ programme has been the SGSPlus+ Framework which has been a golden thread through tutorials, enrichment and the core curriculum with the main aim of holistically developing SGS Students across six main headings of 1) I am Prepared for the Digital World 2) I am Prepared for Society 3) I am Prepared for My Professional Future 4) I am Prepared to Stay Safe and Healthy 5) I am Prepared to be Creative 6) I am Prepared to be an Independent Learner. Throughout this report, each academic area will have their Enrichment grouped under these headings to show the impact that this has had.
- Our New Staffing Structure: 2021-22 also saw the introduction of a new staffing structure within the SGSPlus+ team allowing for the best year of Enrichment and Tutorials to date to take place. The team made up three Enrichment and Tutorial co-ordinators, an SU co-ordinator and a Learning Area Manager Extra-Curricular have supported curriculum in developing an outstanding Enrichment programme that has gone from strength to strength throughout the year with some incredible experiences for students to get involved in including a range of guest speakers, industry professionals, trips, social development activities etc.
- WelcomeFEST 2021! 2021-22 also saw the integration of the SGS WelcomeFEST to replace the College's Induction. The main aim of the WelcomeFEST was to provide a fun introduction to College life, coming back better from the Covid-19 pandemic. The WelcomeFEST involved a number of activities including escape rooms, rock climbing walls, axe throwing, bubble football, festival style games, dance machines along with College induction materials including Principals Welcomes, Campus Tours and Procedures to name a few. Our plans for 2022-23 are to make this even more interactive with orienteering activities, escape rooms and more opportunities to get involved for all students.
- Level Specific Tutorials: This academic year has also seen the introduction of a cross College level specific Tutorial programme that has been delivered across the College. This has been delivered in weekly sessions by curriculum teachers with the support of guest speakers at times throughout the year. These Tutorials have covered a range of topics across the SGSPlus+ Framework but have also covered key topics around Sexual Health, Consent, Sexual Harassment, British Values, PREVENT, Government & Parliament in the UK, COP 2026, Climate Change, Managing Risk to name a few...
- Course Specfic Enrichment Plans and Academies: The integration of the SGSPlus+ framework has allowed for contextualised Enrichment programmes allowing curriculum areas to develop a bespoke offer for their learners which has seen over 20212 Enrichment Activities delivered and an average of 35 hours of Enrichment delivered per learner this academic year.

All of the above has been made possible through the backing of SGS College, the report showcases some of the amazing Enrichment that has been delivered this year.

The SGSPlus+ Programme



At SGS College all students complete 36 Hours of Enrichment, 36 Hours of Tutorials and 36 Hours of Enrichment through the SGSPlus+ programme which is all designed to develop the students for their next steps and progression into either a professional future or developing the students as future citizens.

SGSPlus+ Framework: Pivotal to this approach is the SGSPlus+ framework (shown to the right hand side) which was developed throughout 2019 and has seen the full integration throughout the 2021-22 academic year with integration across Enrichment Programmes, Tutorial Schemes of Work and throughout the Curriculum.

The SGSPlus+ Programme Aims:

The main aim of the SGSPlus+ programme is to holistically develop all SGS College students through the SGSPlus+ Framework. However, sitting as part of this there are four core aims as below.

- To ensure learners have all of the information required to keep them safe whilst studying with us here at SGS (safeguarding)
- To ensure that our learners are prepared and able to step into society once they leave SGS College.
- 3) To ensure that learners have the skills required to succeed post SGS College
- 4) For learners to look back at their time at SGS with fond **memories** filled with fun and enjoyable memories.

The 2021-22 academic year has seen a new approach to Tutorials at SGS College.

- Level Specific Tutorial Programme: In previous years the Tutorial programme has been a linear programme whereby
 regardless of the level of study that students were working towards they would all study the same programme. In 2021-22
 we have seen the integration of a four tiered programme at the College which has seen the development of a Level 1,
 Level 2, Level 3 Year 1 and Level 3 Year 2 Tutorial programme. This approach to tutorials has meant that students who
 are studying at the College for up to four years were exposed to Tutorial topics and relevant content at the right time of
 their journey.
- Meeting the Students Needs: The Tutorial scheme of work has been developed in collaboration with a range of partners both internally and externally at the College. There has been involvement from the SGS Careers, wellbeing and work placement teams. This collaboration has allowed certain tutorial topics to be put in at relevant times of the year (e.g. Sexual Harassment and Consent were delivered in November in order to address the spike of wellbeing/safeguarding concerns that were raised around this time).
- Future Plans: Moving ahead to 2022-23 there are further developments planned in the Tutorial space whereby some areas of the College will move to a menu based approach to tutorials where it can be designed to fit closer to the curriculum but also the localised wellbeing trends for that area of the College. For example if Health and Social Care are covering Equality and Diversity in their course, their tutorial programme can also focus on Equality, Diversity and Inclusion at that time. In addition to this, a new Tutorial sharepoint will be developed for students allowing student to access a range of tutorial resources including journals, articles, videos and websites to develop their knowledge further.


The SGS WelcomeFEST for 2021 took place between the 6th and 17th September 2021 with the main aim of re-socialising students following the Covid-19 pandemic and providing an amazing, fun and enjoyable start to College life!

The WelcomeFEST provided students a range of opportunities to engage in activities including rock climbing, lazer quest, axe throwing, dance machines, festival games and other team building games throughout the two week period. In addition to this, the WelcomeFEST incoporated the Students' Union Freshers Fayre providing an opportunity for students to get involved and meet a range of charities, internal area of the College and Universities.

In addition to the fun team building activities, students were taken through a College wide induction process that included a Welcome from the College Principal, an introduction to the course, the campus tours and procedures, learner charter and student handbooks and an exploration of the digital systems that are being used at the College.

Furthermore, at our WISE Campus our BIPA and BAM students came together for their two week Platform Programme that sees the students collaborate together, learn new skills and build lasting friendships. The platform programme for 2021 finished with a production at the College's Olympus Theatre that allowed parents, guardians and friends to come and explore what the students had achieve in their first two weeks of College.

In 2021 the Students Union Freshers' Fayre was incorporated into the SGS WelcomeFEST aiming to provide a festival of fun and enjoyable activities.

The Freshers Fayre for 2021 saw two Fayre's held, one at the SGS WISE Campus and one at the SGS Stroud Campus. Across the two events, over 150 exhibitors attended ranging from charities, local organisations, employers, internal SGS College services and new for 2021 a range of universities talking about the progression opportunities for our learners.

The Fresher's Fayre being incorporated into the WelcomeFEST provided the opportunity for students to take part in some of the additional activities that formulated WelcomeFEST including the rock clmibing wall, giant darts, football pool. There was also a fantastic opportunity for students to take part in The Drugs Bus which saw students participate in a locked prison cell in order to escape. The clues were all focused around drugs and alcohol with a big focus on education.







The Students' Union!

The Students' Union in 2021-22 has seen an even greater involvement and closer alignment to the SGSPlus+ programme. Throughout the year there have been some key highlights as below;

- SU Hubs: 2021-22 has seen the development of the Students Union hubs at the Filton and Stroud campuses. These hubs have allowed the SU to be the front and centre of College life with opportunities for students to listen to music, play table tennis and socialise with their peers. The SU hubs have become the central part of College with gigs, plant sales and guest speakers all playing a role in the vibrancy of these areas.
- External Relationships: The SU has provided a number of opportunities for students to engage with external organisations, including a partnership with Wheels to Work to provide FREE bikes to students in need living in the Bristol and South Gloucestershire area. As a result of this we have been able to provide 16 bikes in total throughout the academic year.
- Fundraising events for Ukraine: The SU played a pivotal role in fundraising for the SU leading on Flag Face Painting, The Great Cake Sale & Q&A session, Vic Newport's 12 hour Fit-A-Thon, Easter Egg Sale and Raffle supporting the College to raise over £10,000 for the Ukraine Appeal.
- SU elections: The elections provided a great opportunity for students to become more involved within the College, develop transferable skills in readiness for industry and to feel more empowered to have an impact on implementing positive changes in our ever-changing society. We are currently running our elections for the 2022-23 academic year, with 12 learners having registered interest.

Voice of the Learner

Throughout 2021-22 The Students' Union have supported the Quality Team with the Voice of the Learner programme, obtaining feedback, leading meetings and developing the 'You Said, We Did' campaign at the College.

- 178 Learner Reps! Across the College this academic year there were 178 Learner Reps who led the Voice of the Learner, obtaining feedback from their peers and feeding this back to curriculum leaders at the Voice of the Learner.
- 52 Voice of the Learner meetings took place throughout the academic year, providing students and staff the opportunity to collaborate together!
- Over 200 actions that are being worked through from corporate, curriculum, student services and the Students Union.

For 2022-23 a series of developments will be made to the Voice of the Learner in our five step approach to gathering learner voice this includes;

- Students Union Committees: Each year the Students Union will hold committees for a range of minority groups across the College in order to obtain the learner voice and drive change. These will include LGBTQ+ Committee, REACH formerly BAME committee, Inclusion Committee and Sustainability Committees.
- Formal Voice of the Learner: Obtained formally through the Quality team at the College to include First Impressions Survey and End of Year survey to obtain learner feedback.
- Informal Voice of the Learner: The Students Union will also obtain learner voice through a range of campaigns to gather feedback from students including What's in the Box campaigns located in departments and specific spaces of the College to include (LibraryPlus+, Canteen, Students Union Hubs)
- Digital Voice of the Learner: An open inbox allowing for learners to feedback through the newly developed eCampus for learners. This will be monitored constantly and feed into by the Voice of the Learner action plan.
- Voice of the Learner: The Voice of the Learner forum will allow learners to feedback directly about their course. These
 will run six times throughout the year, scaling up the feedback from course level to campus and college wide voice of
 the learners.

SGS Sixth Enrichment!

As part of your study programme at SGS Sixth Form, you will be given the opportunity to attend a weekly enrichment session which will help you pursue both your academic goals and personal interests. 2021-22 saw the full introduction of Enrichment into the SGS Sixth with some key successes;

- Weekly Enrichment Sessions: For 2021-22 the SGS Sixth students were given the
 opportunity to participate in a year long enrichment or a semester based (12 week)
 Enrichment that was built into their timetables for the year. This provided a number
 of fantastic opportunities for students including Debating Society, Putting the F in
 Fiction, Model UN, Sociology in the Modern World, Journalism 101, Creative
 Writing, Chinese Language and Culture, Vision for a sustainable future, Theatre
 Society, Young Enterprise, Bloodhound and the Driving Academy.
- Behind Bars Conference: The behind bars conference saw a range of guest speakers come to the SGS Sixth to talk about their experiences of the UK Justice System come in and deliver talks about their experiences of the UK Justice System. The behind bars day was delivered at Filton Campus and saw psychology, law and sociology students all taking part.
- Bullet Tongue: A specific session was delivered to the SGS Sixth from the Bullet
 Tongue programme that allowed students to learn more around gangs, organised
 crime and drugs in the UK. The session was delivered to over 100 students with
 opportunities for students to ask questions around the content.

In the sessions, we covered everything from; eye tests, learning road signs, understanding hazards and the course concluded with guest speakers from Avon Fire and Road Safety and a driving instructor company.





Construction (Filton)

Throughout the 2021-22 academic year the Construction department at Filton have fully embraced the SGSPlus+ programme providing a number of fantastic opportunities for their students.

- Construction Week Trip: In 2021-22 Construction learners visited the Birmingham NEC on a trip to see the exhibition as part of Construction Week. Learners had the opportunity to hear from a number of employers and trade suppliers relevant to their career.
- Volunteering: A group of carpentry learners put their skills to the test, when they visited WISE Campus to support the Sports Academy and build a shed for them.
- Rockwool: In 2021-22 Rokwool visited the campus to talk about the industry and provide learners with a demonstration to how they insulate their material.
- Wilmot Dixon, Screwfix and Bell Group: All three organisations attended our Freshers' Fayre to provide learners with knowledge to working in the different industries.
- National Painting Show: Learners were treated to a day out in Coventry at the Ricoh arena to watch a wide range of painting demonstrations and gain further industry knowledge.


 Learners took part in regular sessions of Makaton to develop their understanding of sign language.
